Nouns that end in -s, -ss, -sh, or -ch add -es.

bus → buses

class → classes

sandwich → sandwiches

Some nouns that end in -y change to -ies.

city → cities

country → countries

dictionary → dictionaries

Some nouns are irregular.

woman → women

child → children
