## types of words

There are eight main types of words, commonly referred to as the parts of speech in English grammar. Here they are:

Nouns – Words that name people, places, things, or ideas.

**Example: dog, city, happiness** 

Pronouns – Words that take the place of nouns.

Example: he, she, it, they

Verbs – Words that express actions or states of being.

Example: run, go, think

Adjectives – Words that describe or modify nouns.

Example: beautiful, large, red

Adverbs – Words that describe or modify verbs, adjectives, or other adverbs.

**Example:** quickly, very, well

Prepositions — Words that show relationships between nouns (or pronouns) and other words in a sentence.

Example: in, on, at, by

Conjunctions – Words that connect clauses, sentences, or words.

Example: and, but, because, although

Interjections – Words or phrases that express emotions or exclamations.

Example: wow, ouch, oh
