To renew the snake sheds off it's skin which is the mark of the season of renewability, of rebirth. spring refertilizes life in everything after the stasis and death of winter. All the creatures restore their activity. They are moving out of their old skin. The bird is seen chasing the small flies and the bee is making its honey. The arrival of the swallow heralds the spring, but this bird also represents the fleeting cycle of time itself. the bee represents the cycle of nature. The growth of flowers indicates the end of winter.

He use direct comparison by using simile to compares himself to a ship traveling through a large ocean with no land in sight uses the stars to guide its way. In line 2 and 3 when he talk about the ship he refer to the ship "her" as if its human being. But when dark clouds block the light of a guiding star the ship will stray far from its course, deviate from its right way. Metaphorically he indirectly compares this star to trusty guide of the ship . storm describe an argument as being dark, angry ,heated, wet, that cover the star .

English sonnet focused on romantic and idealized love. the love sonnet often celebrated the woman's beauty, comparing in great detail the features of her face and body to forms in nature. the hind wyatt deviates from the typical love sonnet and casts the woman's as deer ,who is pursued in an evidenty ardent fashion.

Q7/What does Sir Thomas Wyatt mean in these lines? Explain Yet may I, by no means, my wearied mind Draw from the deer; but as she fleeth afore Fainting I follow. I leave off therefore, Since in a net I seek to hold the wind Who list her hunt, I put him out of doubt As well as I, may spend his time in vain;

When she flees he follows her tiredly. the poet uses she when he refers to this hind . he use personification giving this animal a human form regarding it as a woman who escapes when he follow her. He surrenders because he feels that this chase is in vain like to hold the wind in a net. Metaphorically ,the poet compares his hunt to the hind to hunt the wind in a net. He states that he will remove any doubt about the wisdom of doing so. Just as his hunt was in vain so would be those of other hunter.

Q8/ What are the characteristics of pastoral Poem? And how does Christopher Marlowe present in his poem "The Passionate Shepherd to his Love"?

a pastoral poem promotes the characteristics of The countryside over those of the town or city, presenting an idealized image of country life that may have been quite at odds with the reality of hard life in harsh conditions. Shepherds are presented as living an peaceful and innocent life in a beautiful environment.

Yet hope I well that, when this storm is past My Helice, the loadstar of my life, Will shine again, and look on me at last, With lovely light to clear my cloudy grief. Till then I wander careful, comfortless, In secret sorrow and sad pensiveness.

He hopes that when this storm passes his beloved's light will shine upon him again and guide him back to the port (her) so they can be together once again. He uses metaphor when indirectly compares the problem which make his beloved to disappear to a storm. Spenser tell his beloved until she forgives him he will keep his grief as a secret, carefully and comfortlessly thinking of sorrowful thoughts.
