Past Simple

 Indicates an action that took place before now, and has no real connection with the current time

He walked to school

- Regular verbs:
- 1- The teacher explained the lesson yesterday.
- 2- We invited them to our party three days ago.
- 3- The police stopped me on my way last night.
- · Irregular verbs:
- 1- We all left the party at 11:00.
- 3- This house cost \$75,000 in 1980.

You will often find the past simple used with time expressions such as these:

- 1. Yesterday
- 2. three weeks ago
- 3. last year
- 4. in 2002
- 5. from March to June (past months)
- 6. for a long time
- 7. for 6 weeks
- 8. in the 1980s
- 9. in the last century

Negative form:

- 1- They travelled abroad last week.
 They <u>didn't travel</u> abroad last week.
- 2- They taught us some Spanish expressions.
 They didn't teach us any Spanish expressions.
- Yes / no questions:
- Did you leave early last time?
- Did they finish their project in 2009?
- Was the food delicious?
- Were they sick last week?
