The Past Tense

There are **four past** tense **forms**:

- 1. The past simple tense
- 2. The past continuous tense
- 3. The past perfect tense
- 4. The past perfect continuous

I worked. I was working. I had worked. I had been working.

(1). The past simple tense is used to describe an action, event, activity that started in the past and ended in the past. The verb form is in past tense. Examples are:

- 1. I smoked.
- 2. She ate fish.
- 3. They <u>watched</u> television.
- 4. He <u>drank</u> tea at breakfast.

Typical time expression used with tense are **yesterday**, **last night/week/** year/month/ summer, ago..etc.

• (2) The Past Continuous tense

The past continuous tense is used to describe a **continuing** action, event, activity that was happening at some point in the past.

subject + was / were + v + (- ing)

- 1. I was smoking.
- 2. She was eating fish.
- 3. They were watching television.
- 4. He was drinking tea at breakfast.

• (3) The Past Perfect Tense

The past perfect tense is used to describe an **action**, event, activity that had happened **before another action** in the past. This means that there are **two actions**, the first in the **past perfect** while the **second** in the **past**. It is formed using:

subject + had + past participle of the verb

1. The thief <u>had escaped</u> before the police <u>arrived</u> .	(two events)
2. The police <u>had arrived</u> before the thief <u>escaped</u> .	(= =)
3. She <u>entered</u> the class after the lesson <u>had started</u> .	· · · ·

4. Ali <u>had typed</u> the message before he <u>mailed</u> it. (= =)

• (4) The Past Perfect Continuous Tense

The past perfect continuous is used to describe an **action** started in the **past** and **continued up** to **another time in the past**. The past perfect continuous is formed using had + been + v + -ing.

- 1. They **had been going** to work.
- 2. We **had been living** there for two years.
- 3. They **had been studying** very hard.
- 4. She had been painting the room for three hours.

The Past Continuous & The Past Perfect Continuous

1- I was eating dinner, when the **doorbell rang**.

2- They were talking, when Tony arrived.

• We use the **Past Continuous** ↑ (was or were + v+ ing) to show that a **longer action** (was eating) in the past continuous was interrupted by a **shorter action** (doorbell rang) in the Simple Past as in sentence (1) above.

• We use the **Past Perfect Continuous** \downarrow (had +been + v+ ing) to show that an <u>action went on</u> (continued) for a period of time (*for an hour*) before a past tense (**doorbell rang**) as in sentences (2) below.

1- I had been eating dinner <u>for an hour</u>, when the doorbell rang.

2. They had been talking *for over an hour* before **Tony arrived**.
