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Title: Combining Sentences Using 'But' and 'And'

The purpose is enhancing Coherence in Writing

Combining Sentences with "And"

Explanation: "And" is used to connect two ideas that are related or similar.

Example 1: "I like to read books. I enjoy watching movies."  $\rightarrow$  "I like to read books, and I enjoy watching movies".

Example 2: "She enjoys hiking. She loves swimming."  $\rightarrow$  "She enjoys hiking, and she loves swimming".

Combining Sentences with "But"

Explanation: "But" is used to connect two contrasting or opposing ideas.

Example 1: "She loves hiking. She is afraid of heights."  $\rightarrow$  "She loves hiking, but she is afraid of heights".

Example 2: "He enjoys playing soccer. He dislikes running." → "He enjoys playing soccer, but he dislikes running".

## Using "But" and "And" in the Same Sentence

Explanation: Sometimes, "but" and "and" are used together to create complex relationships between ideas.

Example: "She loves hiking, and she often goes on long hikes, but she is afraid of heights".

Importance in Writing
