Understanding Personal Pronouns

Definition

Personal pronouns replace nouns, referring to specific people or things. They prevent repetition and make sentences more concise.

Examples

Common personal pronouns include: I, me, you, he, him, she, her, it, we, us, they, them.

Function

These pronouns or what is being discussed.

Subject Pronouns: The Sentence Stars

Definition

Subject pronouns act as the subject of a sentence, performing the action.

Examples

I, you, he, she, it, we, and they are all subject pronouns. They initiate the action.

Usage

I am a student. *They* went to the store. Subject pronouns always come before the verb.

Personal Pronouns

What is a Personal Pronoun?

A personal pronoun is a **pronoun** that is associated primarily with a particular person, in the grammatical sense. When discussing "person" in terms of the grammatical, the following rules apply:

First person, as in "I"

Second person, as in "you"

Third person, as in "It, he, she"

Examples of Personal Pronouns The word "he" is an example of a personal pronoun. He is third person (because he is the person being spoken about), singular, and masculine. The word "we" is another example of a personal pronoun. We is first person (because we are speaking as a group), plural, and neuter.



A subject is a person, place, or thing performing an action, a location where an action is taking place, or an object that an action is about. There are 7 subject pronouns: I, you, he, she, it, we, and they. We and they are plural subject pronouns
